



Dear Mentor

You have been selected as a possible mentor by someone earnestly seeking God's direction in his or her life as they grow towards adulthood. What is a mentor? Technically speaking, a mentor is 'a wise and trusted counsellor or teacher'. The student who has approached you believes you are the person to guide him or her.

Before accepting this responsibility, please prayerfully consider whether this mentor/student relationship is something that you can commit to with dedication, enthusiasm, and clarity.

If you are unsure whether you will be able to fulfil this role effectively and see it through to the end, please decline the opportunity so that the student will be able to make the most of a mentoring relationship with someone else at this critical time of growth in his or her life.

What would your responsibilities entail? The student who has approached you is just beginning to explore God's call towards adulthood on his or her life. They are currently working through a school-run programme guiding them to think through some of the relevant issues from a Biblical perspective. Your responsibility as a mentor would be to assist the student as they begin to formalise their thoughts about what it means to be a man or a woman and God's direction for their life.

Specifically, your responsibilities as a mentor would be as follows:

- a) Commit to pray regularly for your student.
- b) Commit to attending the Celebration Evening, usually held on Wednesday in the second week of December (more details to come).
- c) Commit to meet with your student regularly, choosing a time that is convenient for both of you, allowing at least an hour for conversation and working on your student's Endeavour Project (please see the attached sheet for more details about the Endeavour Project. Your student should have some ideas about what they would like to pursue).
- d) Commit to answering questions about growing up, encouraging and challenging them in their journey towards adulthood.
- e) Commit to transparency with parents and teachers and demonstrate wise confidentiality about what your student shares with you (if you have any concerns or questions about what your student shares, please contact the school for support).
- f) Holding your student accountable for commitments they make.

Thank you for considering mentoring your student and partnering with their parents and Rehoboth Christian College during this year. Please contact the Secondary School if you have any questions or concerns or need any support in this role.

We pray that this mentoring relationship will be fruitful for both student and mentor and look forward to seeing our students grow throughout the year.
