The WASSA:

- formally records a student's achievement in every course, qualification and program that the student has completed in senior secondary schooling.
- provides evidence of achievement.

The WACE- Not all students get a WACE

- The Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) is awarded to students who have successfully completed senior secondary schooling in WACE studies <u>and have met the</u> <u>WACE requirements.</u>
- The majority of students in Western Australia achieve the WACE.
- Study towards the WACE can be undertaken over a lifetime.





WACE Requirements



Students must:

demonstrate the literacy and numeracy standards

meet the requirements for breadth and depth of study

complete one of three course combination options

- □ complete at least four Year 12 ATAR courses OR
- complete at least five Year 12 General courses and/or ATAR courses or equivalent OR
- complete a Certificate II (or higher) VET qualification in combination with ATAR, General or Foundation courses

meet the achievement standard.





WACE Requirements - Demonstrate the literacy and numeracy standards

Students must demonstrate minimum standards of literacy and numeracy by either:

- demonstrating the standard (Level 3 of the <u>Australian Core Skills Framework</u>) through the Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment (OLNA); or

 * Students have two opportunities per year to achieve standard in OLNA.
- pre-qualifying for a particular component by achieving a certain level in the Year 9 NAPLAN and being exempted from that component in the OLNA.

- a minimum of ten Year 12 units or the equivalent (VET/endorsed programs)
- four units from an English learning area course, post-Year 10, including at least one pair of Year 12 units from an English learning area course
- one pair of Year 12 units from List A
- one pair of Year 12 units from List B.

*A unit is one Semester.
