Important information

Information for ATAR students

When ATAR students do not have exams, they may be either studying at home, or at school in room 3.16.
They can also be working with a teacher (by appointment) at school.
If they are at school, they must sign in at Secondary reception.

When students have finished an exam, they must either leave the College signing out at Secondary reception or carry on with study in room 3.16

Information for General pathway students

Students studying the general pathway are expected to attend school as normal. Classes will continue with coursework and assignments.
If students attend TAFE or Work placement on any of these days, they are to attend as normal.

Information for General pathway students with 1 or 2 ATAR exams

Students studying the general pathway who do study 1 or 2 ATAR courses are expected to attend school as normal.
However, they are permitted to have a study day on the day prior to their ATAR exam.
If students attend TAFE or Work placement on any of these days they are to attend as normal (unless they have an exam that day)..

• Students who are absent from any exam must notify the Deputy Principal - Teaching and Learning (Mr Marlow) immediately and provide a medical certificate. No allowance will be made for students who miss an exam due to reading the timetable incorrectly. Mr Marlow will then arrange a catch-up exam time for the student.

READING AND WORKING TIMES

- **Mathematics Examinations** Section 1: Reading Time is 5 minutes – Working Time is 50 minutes
Section 2: Reading Time is 10 minutes – Working Time is 100 minutes
- **Other Written Examinations** 10 minutes reading time and working times listed above

Important information for Students

- Students should be assembled outside the exam rooms **AT LEAST 15 MINUTES BEFORE THE STATED STARTING TIME.**
- Students who are absent from any exam must notify the Deputy Principal - Teaching and Learning (Mr Marlow) **immediately** and provide a medical certificate. No allowance will be made for students who miss an exam due to reading the timetable incorrectly.
- Uniforms must be worn at all times during the exams. The invigilator will take note of students not wearing the uniform.
- You will be provided with **Student Identification Slip** at the commencement of your first exam. Leave it face up on the front right corner of your desk to assist with the attendance check. **This card is to be kept in your pencil case and brought with you for each exam.**
- The following items are not permitted in the examination room:

- If, due to a security risk items (such as mobile phones) cannot be left outside the examination room, then they must be turned off and left at the front of the room with the supervisor with the owner's name clearly marked on the device. Responsibility will not be taken by the College for such items left with a supervisor.

Calculators in Examinations

- Mathematics Applications, Mathematics Methods, and Mathematics Specialist examinations. Calculators will be permitted in *Section Two: Calculator-assumed* section. Candidates can have up to three calculators, which can include scientific, graphic and Computer Algebra System (CAS) calculators. Any brands or models of these calculators are permitted.
- Up to three calculators, which do not have the capacity to create or store programs or text. Any brands or models of these calculators are permitted in examinations in the following courses:

- Calculators must be silent, hand-held and contain their own power source (battery or solar operated).
- Calculators must not have the functionality to communicate wirelessly.
- Candidates will be entirely responsible for ensuring adequate power supply to their calculators and the proper working order of their calculators. If a candidate's calculator malfunctions during an examination, they will not be provided with a calculator.
- Candidates must supply and be able to change their own spare batteries – any battery failure or other fault which limits the usefulness of a calculator during an examination will not be taken into special consideration.
- No candidate may borrow a calculator from another candidate after entering the examination room.
- Calculator memories do not have to be cleared before entry to an examination.

Other items to be brought to Examinations.

- Up to two pages (2 x A4 sheets) of notes **written on both sides** (not folded) maybe taken into the Mathematics ATAR examinations for use in the calculator-assumed section of the paper only.
- Ten minutes reading time will be provided at the start of each examination before writing commences (except for Mathematics courses). The purpose of reading time is for candidates to read all the instructions on the paper, familiarise themselves with the questions and determine which questions they will attempt. No marking of any paper by pen, pencil, highlighter, fingernail or any other items or the use of calculators is permitted during this period. Approved dictionaries can be consulted during this time for all Language (except English) examinations.
- During an examination no communication between candidates is allowed. Candidates wishing to communicate with a supervisor should raise their hand to attract attention. Should any problems occur during the examination, including the onset of illness, the candidate should raise their hand immediately to inform the supervisors.
- Candidates will not be permitted to enter the examination 30 minutes after the completion of reading time. In this instance the candidate should report to Mr Marlow immediately.
- Candidates will not be permitted to leave the examination during the first hour or during the final 15 minutes of the examination.
- Talking is not permitted in the examination room at any time. When candidates have been dismissed from the examination, they should move well clear of the examination room so as not to disturb other candidates.
- You may write using either a pen or pencil, though blue or black pen is preferable.
- Talking, borrowing, suspected collusion, possession of unauthorised materials and breaches of examination regulations may result in the cancellation of the candidate's paper.
- Candidates may bring water to the examination in a clear plastic bottle with all labels be removed. The water bottle should have a secure lid and the capacity of the bottle should be no more than 1500 mL. Water bottles cannot be refilled during the examinations. Food may not be brought into the examination room unless approved by Mr Marlow for medical reasons.
